Forest Heath District Council has prepared a Core Strategy as part of its Local Development Framework which it proposes to submit to the Secretary of State under Section 30 of the above Act.

The Core Strategy sets out the Council's vision for the district and strategic policies which will guide development to 2021 and for residential growth to 2031. The Strategy covers issues related to climate change, natural and built environment, housing, employment, transport, community services and infrastructure.
